The capital of the Eastern province Saxony-Anhalt looks back at more than 1.200 years of history, taking their appearance in the most diverse architectural styles, and embedded in a charming green sphere.



Magdeburg Cathedral as well as the monastery "Unser Lieben Frauen" are witnesses to the Romantic period that had quite an impact on the city. With one of his last great works, the "Grüne Zitadelle", Friedensreich Hundertwasser created an "oasis of humanity" in the middle of the city center. Town houses built in Baroque times, splendid buildings from the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> century and traces of the Jugendstil epoch are as much characteristic as modern architecture by Bruno Taut, the gingerbread style or even the postmodernism.



Despite the manifold influences regarding its architectural consistency, Magdeburg successfully accepts the challenge of being a green cathedral city at the border of the river Elbe. The beautiful landscape at both sides of the river invites for long walks; lordly parks with giant trees are the perfect place for a retreat from the busy city core.



Though, it is also center of sciences. There are two universities that their research mainly concentrate on neurosciences, dynamic systems and the automotive industry on a national and international level: the Otto-von-Guericke University and the University of Applied Sciences Magdeburg-Stendal. Especially the first one, named after the city's mayor of the times after the Thirty Years' War, represents an important aspect of Magdeburg's economy: The fields of brain researches and of immunology have created a network of companies specialized on the fabrication and sale of neuro-scientific and biomedical products.
